Question:

On addressing the problem of ageing correctional facilities, please inform this Committee of the following:

1. What are the respective years of service of the existing facilities in operation? Please set out the details by individual facilities;
2. How much money will be allocated to upgrade individual facilities? What is the manpower requirement? Please set out the details by individual facilities; and
3. Is there a plan to reduce, increase or relocate the existing facilities? If so, what are the details and what are the expenses to be incurred and the manpower requirements involved? Please set out the details by individual facilities.

Reply:

At the end of 2016, of the 29 correctional facilities in operation, 13 have been in operation for 40 years or above. The Correctional Services Department (CSD) has been adopting different measures to improve and replace the ageing facilities. In terms of short-term measures, CSD regularly inspects, maintains and repairs the relevant facilities. In terms of long-term measures, CSD plans and implements improvement and redevelopment projects of correctional facilities, having regard to actual needs.

The number of years of operation of the above 29 correctional facilities, the major improvement projects and the relevant project estimates are set out at Annex.

CSD will continue to closely monitor the changes in the size and composition of the penal population, and deploy resources flexibly to cater for the custodial and rehabilitation needs of persons in custody. The measures will include, among others, the swapping of functions of individual institutions where practicable. The Department will deploy existing manpower and resources to undertake the work concerned.
