Salary

Entry Requirements

(II)	(i) Have Level 2 or equivalent (Note (c)) or above in <u>five subjects</u> in the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination (HKDSEE) (Note (d)), or equivalent; or (ii) Have Level 2 (Note (e)) / Grade E or above in <u>five subjects</u> in the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination (HKCEE) (Note (d)), or equivalent; or	5 (HK\$25,980)
(III)	(i) Have Level 2 or equivalent (Note (c)) or above in <u>three subjects</u> in HKDSEE (Note (d)), or equivalent; or (ii) Have Level 2 (Note (e)) / Grade E or above in <u>three subjects</u> in HKCEE (Note (d)), or equivalent; or	4 (HK\$25,265)
(IV)	Have completed Secondary 5, or equivalent; and	3 (HK\$24,555)

(B)	Have met the language proficiency requirements of Level 2 (Note (e)) or above in Chinese Language and English Language in HKDSEE or HKCEE, or equivalent; or had a pass result in the Assistant Officer II Language Test (Chinese / English); and be able to speak fluent Cantonese and English; and
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(C) Physical Fitness Test (PFT)
Have passed a PFT (please refer to Note (f) and information on 'Recruitment Procedures' at our website); and

(D) Basic Law and National Security Law Test (BLNST)
Have a pass result in the BLNST (Note (g)).

- (a) Entry pay is DS(R)PS Point 3 (HK\$24,555 per month), 4 (HK\$25,265 per month), 5 (HK\$25,980 per month) or 6 (HK\$27,110 per month), as commensurate with the respective entry qualifications.
 - (b) Candidates should possess the relevant academic qualifications by the date of interviews.
 - (c) For civil service appointment purpose, “Attained with Distinction” in Applied Learning subjects (subject to a maximum of two Applied Learning subjects), and ‘Grade C’ in Other Language subjects in HKDSEE are accepted as equivalent to ‘Level 3’ in the New Senior Secondary subjects in HKDSEE. “Attained” in Applied Learning subjects (subject to a maximum of two Applied Learning subjects), and ‘Grade E’ in Other Language subjects in HKDSEE are accepted as equivalent to ‘Level 2’ in the New Senior Secondary subjects in HKDSEE.
 - (d) The subjects may include Chinese Language and English Language.
 - (e) For civil service appointment purpose, ‘Grade C’ and ‘Grade E’ in Chinese Language and English Language (Syllabus B) in the HKCEE before 2007 are accepted administratively as comparable to ‘Level 3’ and ‘Level 2’ respectively in Chinese Language and English Language in the 2007 HKCEE and henceforth.
 - (f) Candidates may refer to the Correctional Services Department’s website (<https://www.csd.gov.hk>) for details. Only those candidates who passed all tests and interviews will be considered for appointment.
 - (g) All applicants for civil service jobs will be assessed on their knowledge of the BLNST. A pass result in the BLNST is an entry requirement for all civil service jobs. Only those candidates who have passed the BLNST will be considered for appointment. For candidates who have not taken the relevant BLNST or have not attained a pass result in the relevant BLNST at the time of application, they may still apply for the job and arrangements will be made for them to take the relevant BLNST during the recruitment process.

Duties

Supervise persons in custody, young offenders in training / rehabilitation / detention centres and drug addicts in drug addiction treatment centres; and perform any other duties as required.

(Note: subject to the provisions of the Prisons Ordinance, an Assistant Officer II is required to wear uniform and work shifts and may be required to undertake hospital nursing duties and live in departmental quarters.)

Training

Newly recruited Assistant Officers II must undergo training course lasting for 23 weeks in total at the Hong Kong Correctional Services Academy, which includes field training at various correctional institutions.

Promotion Prospects

Assistant Officer II can be promoted to Assistant Officer I or appointed to the Officer grade by Potential Officer Scheme.

Welfare

Assistant Officers II can enjoy a number of welfare facilities, including paid leave, medical and dental benefits and where appropriate, assistance in housing. They can also become members of the Staff Club, facilities of which include swimming pools, tennis courts, children playground, restaurant, bar, etc. The department runs a welfare fund to assist staff and their families. In addition, there are staff recreation rooms in all institutions for the use of the staff.
